1	The national day for traditional costume	1 <sup>st</sup> November	Algeria	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Algerians wear their traditional costumes in government institutions such as schools and universities.</li> <li>– The purpose is to encourage tourism.</li> </ul>
2	Nowruz	21 March	Iraq and Syria (and other countries)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– Kurdish people celebrate it.</li> <li>– The word "Nowruz" means the 'New Day' in the Kurdish language.</li> <li>– Some of the rituals include wearing traditional costumes and celebrating it in nature. Also, preparing a meal which contains seven things beginning with the letter Seen/س, called the 'Seven-Seens'.</li> </ul>
3	Easter	4 <sup>th</sup> April – 8 <sup>th</sup> May	Most Arab countries (and the world)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>– The celebration starts with the ringing of church bells and church visits.</li> <li>– One of the highlights of the celebration is the colouring of eggs.</li> </ul>
